SEI Certification Bulletin - Follow Up #3

SEI CPM Access

As a reminder to everyone, you can access and review the SEI Certification Program Manual (CPM) online on the SEI website. The CPM is your guide book for the SEI certification and participation process. At this point the most important Sections to review are 1 through 19. The NOCSAE program section, Section 30, is almost ready to be incorporated into the CPM and will be available soon. As mentioned previously, Section 28 is the current recreational program section and will give you an idea how Section 30 will be set up. To access the CPM, you will need an SEI-supplied User Name and Password. Please provide the following information to Bill Fithian (bfithian@seinet.org) to obtain the User Name and Password credentials:

- First Name
- Last Name
- Unique 4-digit number (this will become part of your password)
- Organization
- E-mail address
- Telephone number

Your unique User Name and Password will be emailed to you within a few days, along with additional instructions on how to use this section of the website. Your new credentials will be effective immediately upon your receipt.
